## **DIGGING DEEPER**

- Have you ever felt like something you did in the past disqualified you or made you feel undeserving?
- Read Luke 23:13-43.
  - Pilate was in the position to judge
     Jesus correctly and deferred to the
     crowd in order to preserve his
     status as a somebody. In what ways
     can you relate to the pressure of the
     crowd?
  - There were two very contrasting responses to Jesus by the criminals who were next to him on the cross.
    Which attitude is more difficult to identify with: the humble or the mocking cynic?
  - Jesus appeared to be a nobody at this point in the story, yet he still worked to let someone else know they were a somebody. Identify biases that might interfere with your ability to show love to certain members of society.
  - Consider this thought: everything Jesus did was a statement about God. What can you infer about God after reading this passage?
- If Jesus was willing to rescue the convicted criminal who saw hope in him, how might that change the way you feel about your own past mistakes?
- Is there someone in your life you have struggled to forgive? Take a few moments and ask God to help you offer mercy just as Jesus does.
